Over millions of years, Earth's rotation has been slowing down due to friction effects associated with the tides driven by the Moon. That process adds about 2.3 milliseconds to the length of each day every century. A few billion years ago an Earth day was only about 19 hours.Atomic clocks, combined with precise astronomical measurements, have revealed that the

length of a day is suddenly getting longer, and scientists don't know why. This has critical impacts not just on our timekeeping, but also on things like GPS and other technologies that govern our modern life. Over the past few decades, Earth's rotation around its axis - which determines how long a day is - has been speeding up. This trend has been making our days shorter; in fact, in

Assam Rising, Margherita, August 9: On the eve of Independence Day, militant outfits launched a deadly attack on the army. Suspected militants belonging to proscribed outfits NSCN (K) and ULFA (I) attacked a camp of Assam Rifles at Pangsau Pass along the Indo-Myanmar border in Arunachal Pradesh's Changlang district on Tuesday morning. There is no confirmed report of any casualties in the militants' attack, but some reports claimed that one Assam Rifles jawan was killed in the attack. Reliable sources said, a joint team of NSCN (K) and ULFA (I) with heavy weapons attacked the newly built Assam Rifles camp located at Pangsau Pass on Tuesday morning at around 4. In retaliation, the Assam Rifles fired on them and a gunfight broke out between them but no casualties have been reported, said a source. Confirming the incident Changlang Superintendent of Police (SP) Mihin Gambo said firing was reported from the Pangsau Pass area this morning."It is immediately not known which insurgent groups were involved in the attack," SP Gambo said. Meanwhile, security forces have launched a massive operation along the Indo-Myanmar border in Changlang district. Recently, Assam Rifles have carried out massive operations against the insurgent groups in Tirap, Longding and Changlang regions of Arunachal Pradesh and managed to nab several NSCN cadres. Pangsau Pass area is one of the remotest areas in Arunachal Pradesh and shares boundary with Myanmar. Most of the insurgent groups of the Northeast have set up their camps in the jungles of Myanmar and sneak into Arunachal Pradesh through jungle routes.

Harsh response from China

The historic visit of the US House speaker, Nancy Pelosi, to Taiwan has certainly triggered a harsh response from China. The People's Liberation Army (PLA) has been conducting a series of drills around the island that amount to a partial blockade of the Taiwan Strait. In addition, Beijing has announced sanctions against Taiwan, affecting goods from pineapple cakes (a Taiwanese delicacy) to oranges; it has also declared eight countermeasures in response to Pelosi's visit, which included cancelling dialogues between the leaders of Chinese and US military theatres and suspending the joint Sino-US talks on climate change. Tension in the Taiwan Strait has put the world on edge. The G7 foreign ministers last week called on China to "resolve cross-Strait differences by peaceful means". However, there has also been much criticism of Pelosi. For instance, in the New York Times, Thomas Friedman characterised her visit as "utterly reckless, dangerous, and irresponsible". For such critics, it could not have happened at a worse time: 1 August is PLA Day, a holiday celebrating the founding of the Chinese army. Furthermore, the visit happened right before the Beidaihe conference - a secretive gathering of Chinese Communist party elites where major policy decisions are made - and the 20th CCP congress, where President Xi Jinping is widely believed to be pursuing an unprecedented third term. The timing thus made Pelosi's visit highly provocative. Xi could hardly afford to lose face to the Americans at this critical juncture. One implication of these criticisms is that the current tension could be diffused after a few months. Once Beijing felt that it had sufficiently rebuked Pelosi and punished Taipei, the tension could subside. We are not so optimistic. Pelosi's visit was merely a trigger. The crisis reflects deeper issues in Sino-US relations. If they are not addressed, we expect more instability in the Taiwan Strait and the evolution of great power competition into great power conflict. In the past few years, policymakers, opinion leaders and members of the public in China have increasingly compared America to a "paper tiger". On the one hand, the US is believed to be pernicious. Jealously guarding its own hegemony, it does not and cannot accept China's rise, they say; since the Trump administration, Washington has started to systematically hollow out the "one China principle" with the intention of using Taiwan as a pawn to contain China. On the other hand, Washington is believed to lack resolve and capabilities. Although the US is malicious, it is also weak, runs the line. While China's 1.4 billion citizens are united in their pursuit of the "Chinese dream", America is plagued by internal contradictions ranging from partisan polarisation to racial tension. If the US did not send troops to Ukraine, surely it lacks the stomach to defend Taiwan? Notably, Hua Chunying, China's foreign ministry spokesperson, was mocking America as a "paper tiger" on Twitter just days before Pelosi went to Taiwan. This "paper tiger" line significantly complicates efforts to maintain stability across the Taiwan Strait. If Pelosi had decided to cancel her trip to Taiwan after Beijing's protest, China would probably have launched a propaganda campaign ridiculing Washington's claim that its commitment to Taiwan was "rock solid". However, whenever the US tries to signal its resolve and capabilities, Beijing is likely to interpret this as evidence of hostility. Washington is caught between Scylla and Charybdis. If the US attempts to reassure China, that risks looking like appeasement. If it signals its intention to defend the liberal international order in the Indo-Pacific, that could trigger an uncontrollable security dilemma. In the context of this dynamic, can we be confident that Beijing would not have raised tensions at some later date even if Pelosi had not visited Taiwan? How would Beijing react were the US to sell Taiwan offensive weapon systems comparable to those that have been recently supplied to Ukraine? We might debate how provocative Pelosi's visit would look in comparison with arms sales (some may perceive the former as a more overt challenge to Chinese sovereignty). But this very discussion draws attention to the underlying dynamic that makes US actions provocative to China. Focusing on Pelosi's visit distracts us from the deeper problems that plague Sino-US relations. Beijing needs to recognise how destabilising and counterproductive the "paper tiger" analogy is. It complicates any attempt to construct "guard rails" that would prevent US-China competition becoming US-China confrontation. Beijing needs to stop suggesting that the US lacks the will to guard the liberal international order in the Indo-Pacific. Jeering at America's resolve is not only dismissive and insulting but also counterproductive. Even if the US does lack resolve, taunting it serves only to fuel anti-China sentiments and force Washington to harden its position.

with GPS enabled tracking device fitted in public service vehicles aims to enhance Road and Passenger safety. Under the eTransport project, the VLT Device fitment process, as well as the tracking and monitoring through Command & Control System are facilitated to different states in India.

Any technology-led initiative or scheme is aimed at ensuring efficient delivery of services to the citizens. The computerization of various operations has transformed the traditional cumbersome processes, thereby ensuring increased transparency, ease of use, and readily available online services. The need for citizens and transporters to visit RTOs has been significantly reduced with the widespread adoption of the digital payments system, web-based service requests, online document upload, document verification, online appointment, etc. Transport Officials and Staff across the country now have the benefit of working with a modern, integrated system which has given a boost to their productivity. These IT-led initiatives have also contributed to the revenue of the states by provisioning new revenue streams (for example Fancy Number Auction) and reduction of leakages (through ePayment etc.). Compliance with rules and acts has increased significantly due to the adoption of applications like e-Challan Traffic Enforcement Solution, Integrated Pollution Control System, Vehicle Tracking System, etc. The top authorities comprising the Ministry, State Transport Departments are making use of the data-driven dashboards which will help them make informed decisions and thereby formulating better policies. With multiple stakeholders, the transport ecosystem has emerged as a Public Digital Platform where the exchange of data and services has grown tremendously, thus creating a constructive synergy.

he surreal, often absurd time: last week, the oil and gas githe spring of 2023, prices look that this is going to be very Labour party - but that only high-Conservative leadership election meanders on. Both candidates frantically float ideas for disrupting everything from university term dates to doctors' pensions, while the Sunday Telegraph endorses Liz Truss as "the first truly philosophy-driven leader since Margaret Thatcher", and Rishi Sunak stoically insists that he loves dancing. But we all know the gravity of the crisis that is now enveloping us, and it makes the vanities of their battle seem like some strange hallucination related to the summer's stifling heat.By the autumn, the victor - Truss, in all likelihood - may well be still trying to convince us that they are leading a national sprint towards sunlit uplands that only they can see. But the game is already up: the immediate future will be defined by skyrocketing energy prices, economic woe and a profound social emergency - and power will be a grinding matter of crisis management. Everything will become clear on 26 August, when the energy regulator Ofgem will announce the new price cap due to come into force on 1 October. Back in April, it increased by 54%, pushing up the typical annual household fuel bill to £1,971. Now, as Russia continues to choke off the supply of natural gas to western Europe, recent projections have suggested an increase of about 70%, to £3,359 a year and in January, prices will go up again by an estimated 8%. Late last week, one group of analysts said that Ofgem's decision to alter the price cap every three months meant that annual bills could exceed £4,200. Self-evidently, these hikes - which look as if they will endure into 2024 - will also have big consequences for general

Much the same applies to the one-off payments the government has introduced to parry the effects of energy price rises: £400 to all households (to be paid in instalments between October and next March), and another £300 for pensioners, and an extra "one-off cost of living payment" to 8m households on means-tested benefits, both of which will have been issued by the end of this year. This help is significant, but it is not set to be repeated. Crude lump sums, moreover, take no account of people's particular circumstances; much of the money, poverty experts say, will be swallowed up by already existing debt. Ministers would doubtless rebuff such points by also highlighting their pledge to increase benefits next April by this September's rate of inflation - but

In the financial year 2019-20, just under 20% of UK households were in that category, according to recent research by the University of York's Jonathan Bradshaw and Antonia Keung, and published by the Child Poverty Action Group. But their projection suggests that, without further measures - and even factoring in the universal £400 rebate - this figure is set to jump to well over 50% by the start of next year. In Northern Ireland, they reckon, 70% of households will be in fuel poverty; in Scotland, Wales and the north-west of England it will be about 60%. Fuel poverty, the research projects, will soon affect nearly 90% of single parents with two or more children. This kind of research, Prof Bradshaw told me, is complicated, and bound by the limits of official statistics: the basic



Length of Earth's days are suddenly

June 2022 we set a record for the shortest day over the past half a century or so. But despite this record, since 2020 that steady speedup has curiously switched to a slowdown, days are getting longer again, and the reason is so far a mystery. While the clocks in our phones indicate there are exactly 24 hours in a day, the actual time it takes for Earth to complete a single rotation varies ever so slightly. These changes occur over periods of millions of years to almost instantly, even earthquakes and storm events can play a role. Over millions of years, Earth's rotation has been slowing down due to friction effects associated with the tides driven by the Moon. That process adds about 2.3 milliseconds to the length of each day every century. A few billion years ago an Earth day was only about 19 hours. For the past 20,000 years, another process has been working in the opposite direction, speeding up Earth's rotation. When the last ice age ended, melting polar ice sheets reduced surface pressure, and Earth's mantle started steadily moving toward the poles. Just as a ballet dancer spins faster as they bring their arms toward their body - the axis around which they spin - so our planet's spin rate increases when this mass of mantle moves closer to Earth's axis. And this process shortens each day by about 0.6 milliseconds each century. Over decades and longer, the connection between Earth's interior and surface comes into play too. Major earthquakes can change the length of the day, although normally by small amounts. For example, the Great Tohoku Earthquake of 2011 in Japan, with a magnitude of 8.9, is believed to have sped up Earth's rotation by a relatively tiny 1.8 microseconds. Apart from these largescale changes, over shorter periods weather and climate also have important impacts on Earth's rotation, causing variations in both directions. The fortnightly and monthly tidal cycles move mass around the planet, causing changes in the length of day by up to a millisecond in either direction. We can see tidal variations in length-of-day records over periods as long as 18.6 years. The movement of our atmosphere has a particularly strong effect, and ocean currents also play a role. Seasonal snow cover and rainfall, or groundwater extraction, alter things further. Since the 1960s, when operators of radio telescopes around the planet started to devise techniques to simultaneously observe cosmic objects like quasars, we have had very precise estimates of Earth's rate of rotation. A comparison between these estimates and an atomic clock has revealed a seemingly ever-shortening length of day over the past few years.But there's a surprising reveal once we take away the rotation speed fluctuations we know happen due to the tides and seasonal effects. Despite Earth reaching its shortest day on June 29 2022, the long-term trajectory seems to have shifted from shortening to lengthening since 2020. This change is unprecedented over the past 50 years. The reason for this change is not clear. It could be due to changes in weather systems, with back-to-back La Nina events, although these have occurred before. It could be increased melting of the ice sheets, although those have not deviated hugely from their steady rate of melt in recent years. Could it be related to the huge volcano explosion in Tonga injecting huge amounts of water into the atmosphere? Probably not, given that occurred in January 2022. Scientists have speculated this recent, mysterious change in the planet's rotational speed is related to a phenomenon called the 'Chandler wobble', a small deviation in Earth's rotation axis with a period of about 430 days. Observations from radio telescopes also show that the wobble has diminished in recent years; the two may be linked. One final possibility, which we think is plausible, is that nothing specific has changed inside or around Earth. It could just be long-term tidal effects working in parallel with other periodic processes to produce a temporary change in Earth's rotation rate. Precisely understanding Earth's rotation rate is crucial for a host of applications, navigation systems such as GPS wouldn't work without it. Also, every few years timekeepers insert leap seconds into our official timescales to make sure they don't drift out of sync with our planet. If Earth were to shift to even longer days, we may need to incorporate a 'negative leap second', this would be unprecedented, and may break the internet. The need for negative leap seconds is regarded as unlikely right now. For now, we can welcome the news that, at least for a while, we all have a few extra milliseconds each day.

Burmese wood worth of 20 lakhs seized in Srirampur: held 2

Assam Rising, Gossaigaon, August-9: Simultapu police led by Sanjay Kumar Rai i/c, Simultapu out post on Monday intercepted huge quantity of suspected Burmese timber from Srirampur NH-31(C) along with a truck and arrested the driver and handyman of the truck while it it was on the way to deliver the smuggled timber in West Bengal befooling the police. According to the information available here, acting on a secret input Simultapu police led by Sanjay Rai i/c, Simultapu outpost carried out a search operation on a truck bearing registration number NL02-Q-8967 that was parked in a Dhaba. The truck was then brought to Simultapu out post after it was confirmed that there is a huge quantity of timber which was kept hidden with sacks of old bottles on the timber. The thorough checking of the truck was carried out in



presence of Nabanita Sharma, SDPO Gossaigaon at Simultapu outpost and recovered 80 nos. of huge timber shells from inside the truck. Two persons who have been arrested by the police have been identified as Robin Chatterjee (27) driver of Kolkata and Deepak Dehoria (19) handiman hailing from Madhya Pradesh. In the preliminary investigation it is disclosed that the truck was heading towards Kolkata from Dimapur to deliver the smuggled timber. The market value of the seized timber would be around INR 20 lakhs, police said. While the seized timber is believed to be Burmese timber, it would be confirmed only after investigation, police said. It may be mentioned that some notorious cyclical circle along the Assam-Bengal border has been trying to secretly smuggle Burmese supari and Burmese timber out of the state in parallel with narcotics but the police in charge of the border have also succeeded in busting out such illegal activities on the basis of reliable information. Meanwhile, Sanjay Kumar Rai, i/c, Simultapu police out post vehemently told the reporters that the illegal businessman would not be spared in any way and the police operation against the prohibitory action would continue.

IndianOil has invested Rs. 169.11 Cr and there shall be more in the days to come. The plant has a rated capacity of 60000 TMTPA and can bottle 17000 Cylinders per day – both Domestic & Commercial. It can store 1350 MT in leak proof mounded bullets of LPG and shall cater to 8 districts of Tripura viz. West, South & North Tripura, Dhalai, Unakoti, Sepahijala & Gomati. There are two 8 Bay TLDs to decant Bulk LPG received by TTs. The TTs are decanted using 2 LPG Pumps at the rate of 110 cubic meter per hour. Can't pay, won't pay: thousands in Britain vow to ignore energy bills

London, August 09: Like millions of people across Britain, Josina, a teacher from Sheffield, is being pushed into poverty by rising energy prices. This October, when bills are set to rise again, she will have to cut back on food and other essentials if she has any hope of keeping up with the payments."It's terrifying, especially with three teenagers in the house. They aren't old enough to be out working yet. They're relying on us, and it's a really scary thought that you potentially can't provide for your children in that way," she said. So Josina, 35, has made a decision: she is not going to pay her energy bill. She is one of thousands of activists joining a civil disobedience movement protesting at the soaring cost of energy. From 1 October, the energy price cap - the maximum amount suppliers can charge in England, Scotland and Wales - will go up, leading to further bill rises for millions of customers. The typical gas and electricity bill is expected to reach £3,358 in October, according to consultancy Cornwall Insight. In October 2021, the average annual bill was £1,400. Protesters are expected to take to the streets. But as well as more traditional campaigning methods, they also plan to pile pressure on energy suppliers and the government by ignoring their bills and cancelling their direct debits. Don't Pay UK, the anonymous group organising the campaign, says it hopes enough people will follow suit to put energy companies in "serious trouble". "We want to bring them to the table and force them to end this crisis." its website says. The movement has been condemned by the government. "This is highly irresponsible messaging, which ultimately will only push up prices for everyone else and affect personal credit ratings," a spokesperson said. "While no government can control global gas prices, we are providing £37bn of help for households, including the £400 discount on energy bills, and £1,200 of direct support for the most vulnerable households to help with the cost of living."Debt and financial experts, meanwhile, are telling people to ensure they are fully informed of the potential risks of not paying, such as increased debt, and the chance of being put on a prepayment meter, or charged extra. In extreme cases, suppliers could cut the energy off, although this is rare. Josina is aware of the risks, and says not paying is the only option for her and millions of others. In recent days, she has taken to the streets to hand out hundreds of flyers, and says the response has been "really positive". "People are angry and scared," she said. "We aren't doing this out of choice. Millions of people across this country are going to be plunged into poverty this winter. And the strike is the only way we can push back. It's not a choice that anyone's taking lightly. I would much rather not have to do this. But it's the only choice we have." Don't Pay UK, which launched in June, said more than 75,000 people had so far signed up to join the strike if radical action is not taken by the government.





England finished with a record 176 medals - 57 of them gold - at Birmingham 2022 but fell narrowly short of the goal of outperforming table-topping Australia at the home Commonwealth Games. Driven by dominance across sports such as gymnastics and diving, England beat their previous record of 174 at Glasgow 2014 and, although Australia finished ahead on the leaderboard with 178 medals, Team England's chef de mission, Mark England, hailed the efforts of his team."This has been an absolutely exceptional Games for Team England and what's been exceptional about it, I think, is the fact that it's a very young team, an ambitious team," England said. "We've got 17year-olds who are winning gold medals. It is by some margin the best home performance of any English


